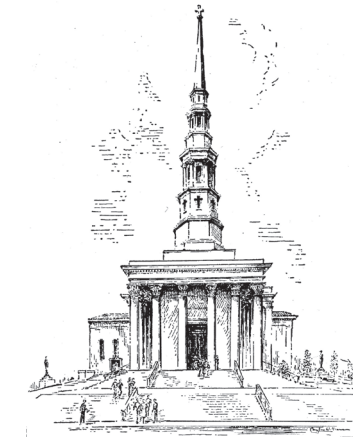

Nicene Creed
