Prayer for Vocations

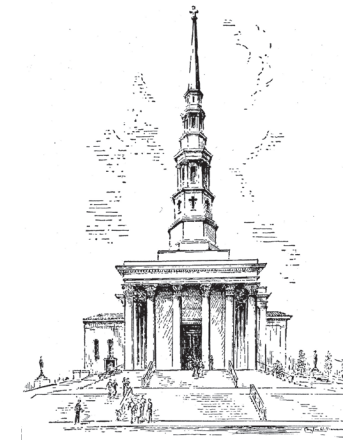


Apostles' Creed

Hide Not Thy Face and Call to Remembrance






