who make your justice their joyful acclaim.

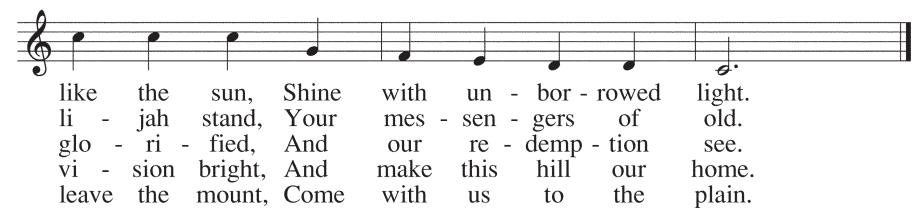
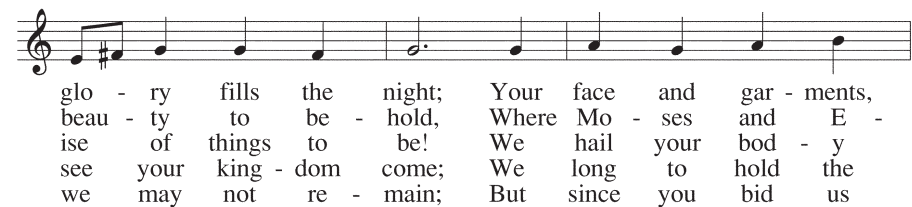
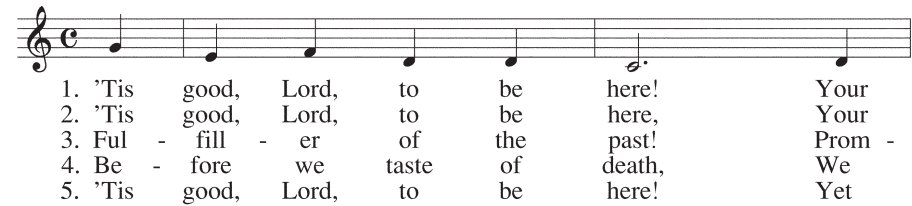

**Prayer for Vocations**

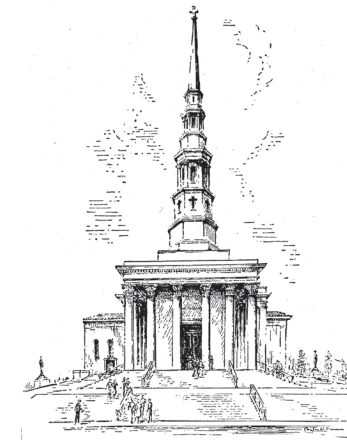
**A**lmighty Father, You have created us for some definite purpose. Grant

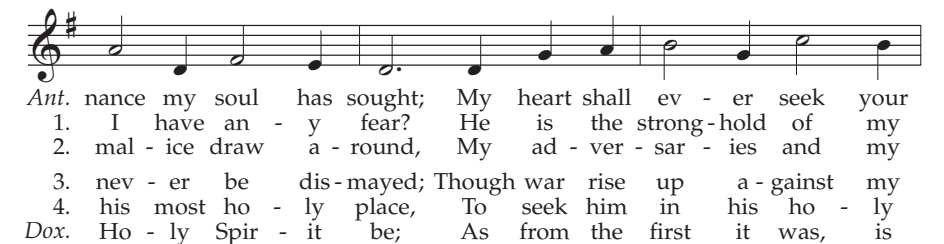
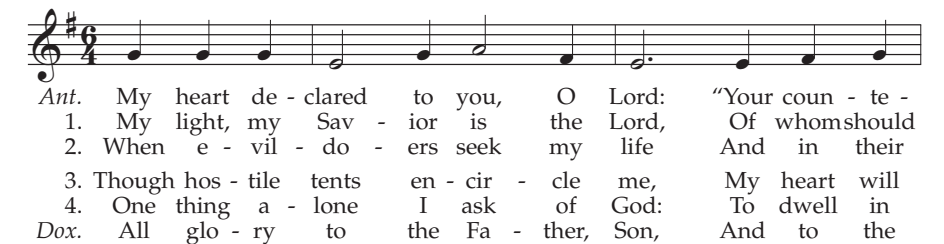
