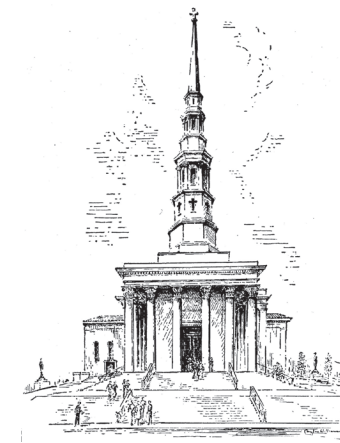
Prayer for Vocations
