Prayer for Vocations

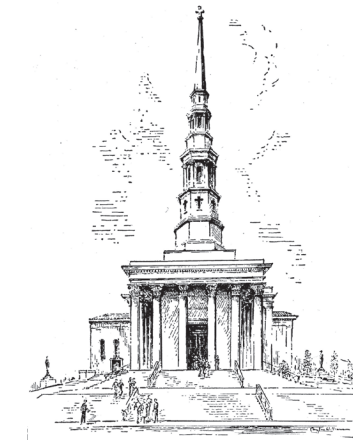


